ORDER

In the D.O. letter read above, Director of Collegiate Education has reported that certain private college managements are appointing teachers without observing the UGC norms on workload, qualification, etc and that if such an unhealthy practice is allowed it will lead to several administrative problems and also to become an obligation to Government for making payment of salary to the teachers thus appointed. Hence the Director of Collegiate Education has requested Government to issue orders making it obligatory on the part of the Private College Managements to seek prior approval of the Director of Collegiate Education for filling up of any vacancy arising out of retirement, leave or introduction of new courses. In this connection the Director of Collegiate Education has also pointed out that the issue of such orders will be quite in tune with the provisions under Statute 75, Chapter 5 of the Kerala University First Statutes.

2. Government have examined the matter in detail and order that vacancies of teachers arising in the Private Colleges by way of retirement, leave or introduction of new courses shall only be filled up with the prior permission.
